SUMMARY OF THE POSITION

Person who conducts socially oriented activities in accordance with the techniques specific to her/his profession.

SPECIFIC FUNCTIONS

According to the responsibilities normally for his/her job title, the position holder shall design and proceed by individual, family or group approach for the application of the psychosocial treatment plan required by the department's clientele.

In a non-restrictive manner, he/she will be called upon to assess the service needs of children, teenagers and parents who are entrusted to him/her by virtue of the YPA or the Act respecting health & social services, check regularly the children and teenagers' living conditions in their environment, accompany them, support them and refer them as need to the appropriate resources.

When required, he/she can be called upon to carry out intervention for emergencies and to take on the evaluation and treatment in continuity in accordance to the laws in effect. He/she will take care especially of the stabilized files, Inter YP/YCJA file transfers, and sometimes inter YC (Youth Protection Services Center) services.

More specifically he/she will receive reports regarding children, analyze them briefly and decide whether they must be evaluated further;

Will be called upon to work on the day, evening shifts and on weekends.

REQUIREMENTS

Education:

- Diploma of college studies with specialization in Social Work Techniques, or Social Assistance Techniques from a school recognized by the ministère de l'Éducation, du Loisir et du Sport;
- This job title also includes the persons who, after having acquired pertinent experience, have a certificate of college studies in Social Work Techniques or Social Assistance Techniques;
- Holder of the Nonviolent Crisis Intervention training is an asset or willingness to follow it.

Knowledge and Abilities:

- Knowledge of and experience with public and community health prevention and promotion related approaches, methods, issues and programming (and in First Nation contexts being an asset);
- Knowledge of MSSS programs and regulations for first lines services is an asset;
- Knowledge of Cree culture, and social/health issues in Eeyou Istchee is an asset;
- Knowledge of Eenou/Eeyou Miyupimaatsiiun healing practices and paradigms is an asset;
- Good understanding of developmental psychology, and social domains;
- Ability to work with the targeted clientele
- Excellent teamwork skills;
- Excellent critical thinking, organizational and decision-making skills;
- Excellent communication skills, both group animation, written and presentation;
- Ability in office-related computer applications.
